



APPROVED MANUFACTURING PROJECTS FROM JAPAN (2007 – JULY 2014)




MALAYSIA-JAPAN ECONOMIC PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT (MJEPA)

Jan - July 2014: USD1,596 million



LEP 1.0>> TECHNOLOGY SHARING >> PROTON & PETRONAS TWIN TOWERS



- Japanese technologies through the implementation of Japanese investment projects have facilitated industrial development in Malaysia.
- In 1983, the National Car Project, PROTON was established through the partnership of HICOM and Mitsubishi.
- The construction of the west tower of the Petronas Twin Towers and the Menara Dayabumi by Japanese companies.





LEP 1.0>> TRADE LIBERALIZATION >> MJEPA

- Conclusion of Malaysia's first FTA which is the Malaysia Japan Economic Partnership Agreement (MJEPA) in 13 July 2006.
- Both countries have agreed to undertake cooperation in several areas such as in the development of the automotive industry in Malaysia i.e. Malaysia-Japan Automotive Industry Cooperation (MAJAICO), Agriculture, ICT, Education and HRD, Science and Technology, SMEs, Tourism and Environment.



LEP 1.0>> EDUCATION >> MALAYSIA-JAPAN INTERNATIONAL INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY (MJIIT)

- >> Malaysia-Japan International Institute of Technology (MJIIT) was established as part of International campus at the University Technology Malaysia in Kuala Lumpur.
- >> The first intake was on 12 September 2011 and a total of 470 students enrolled in Semester 2013/2014.




>> Japanese training methods such as kaizen, 5S, Kanban and Total Productive Maintenance (TPM) are practised by many Malaysian companies.


